Make 2 holes here and tie together with a piece of string.

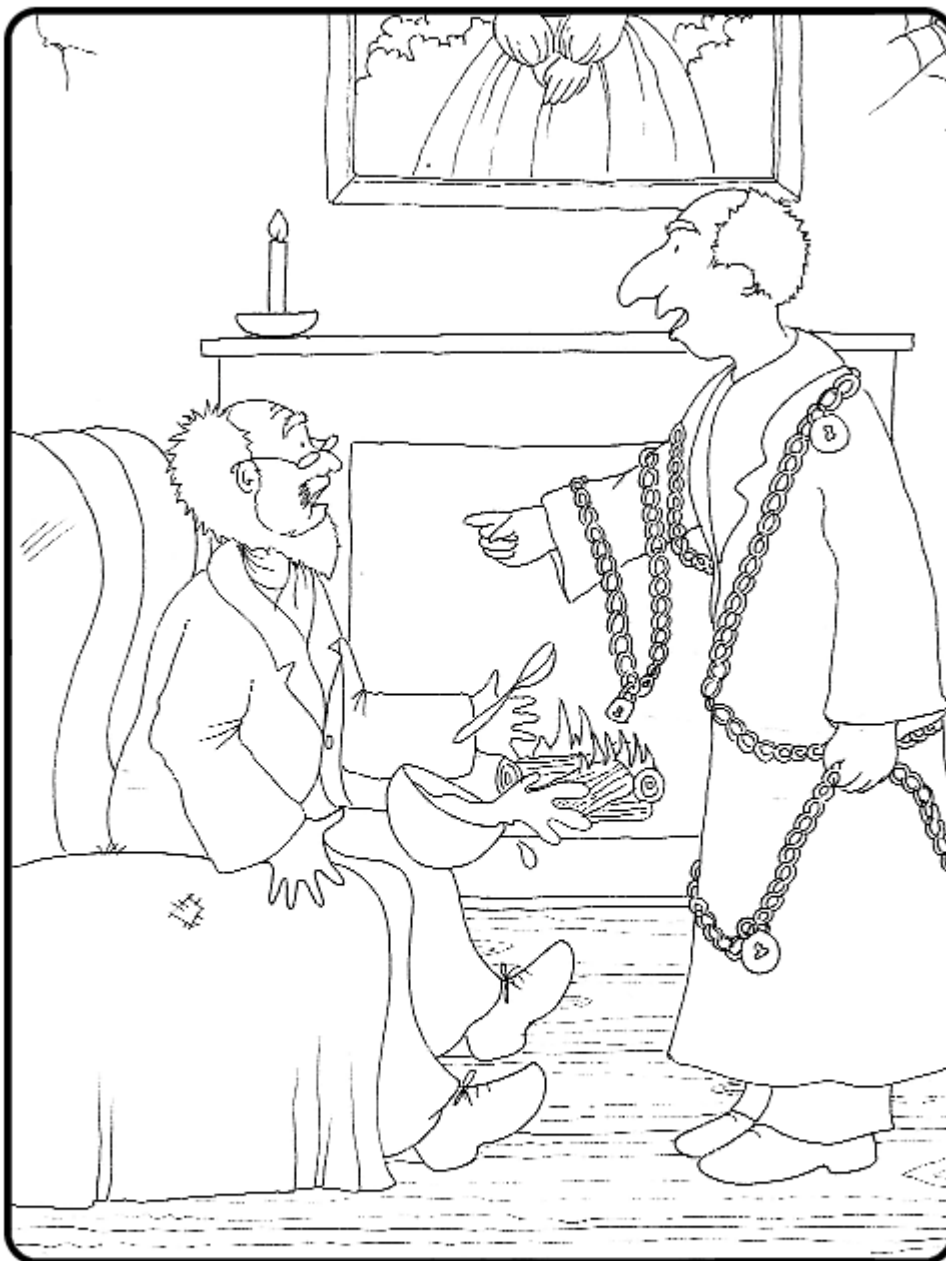

Make 2 holes here and tie together with a piece of string.

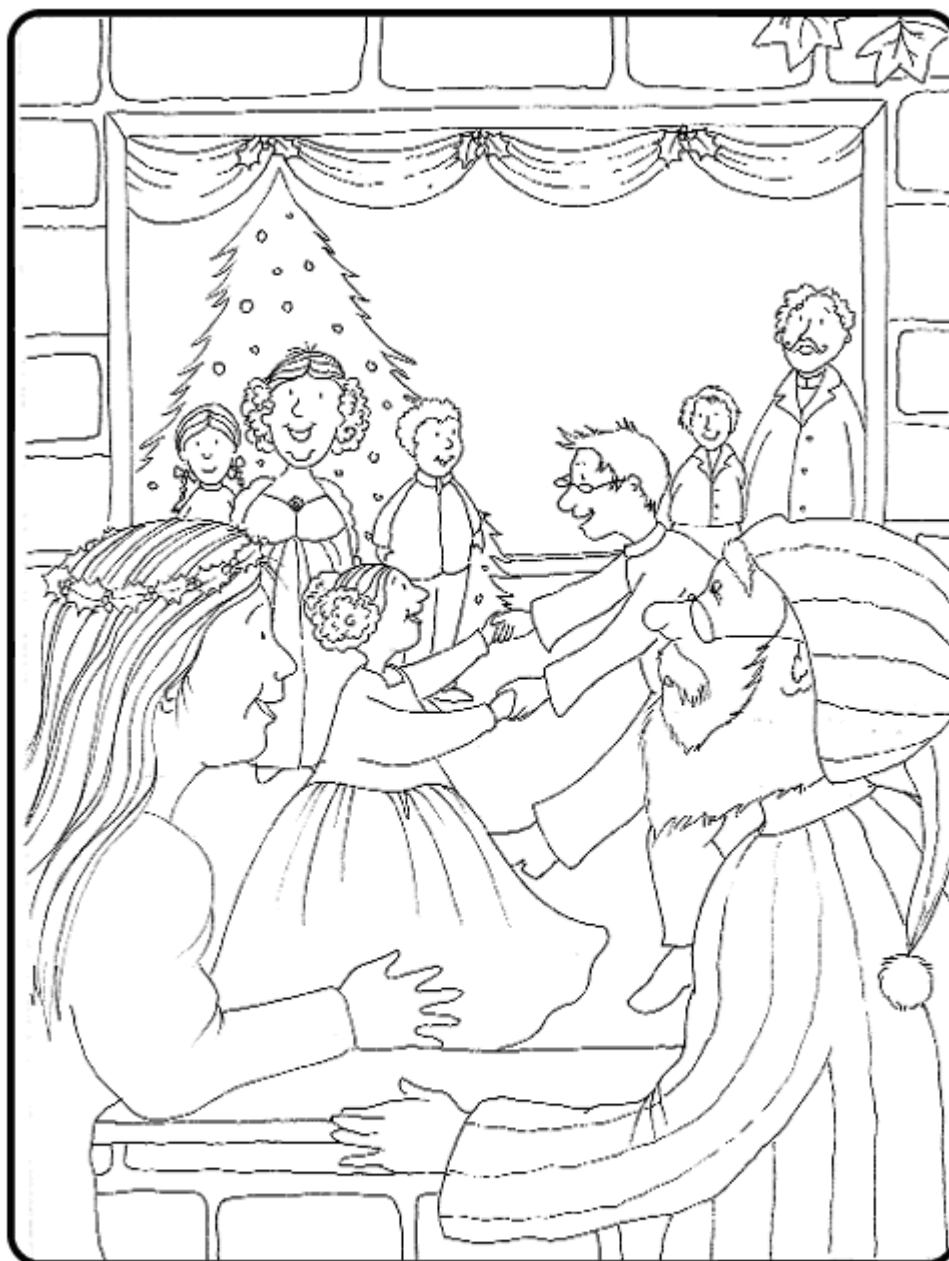

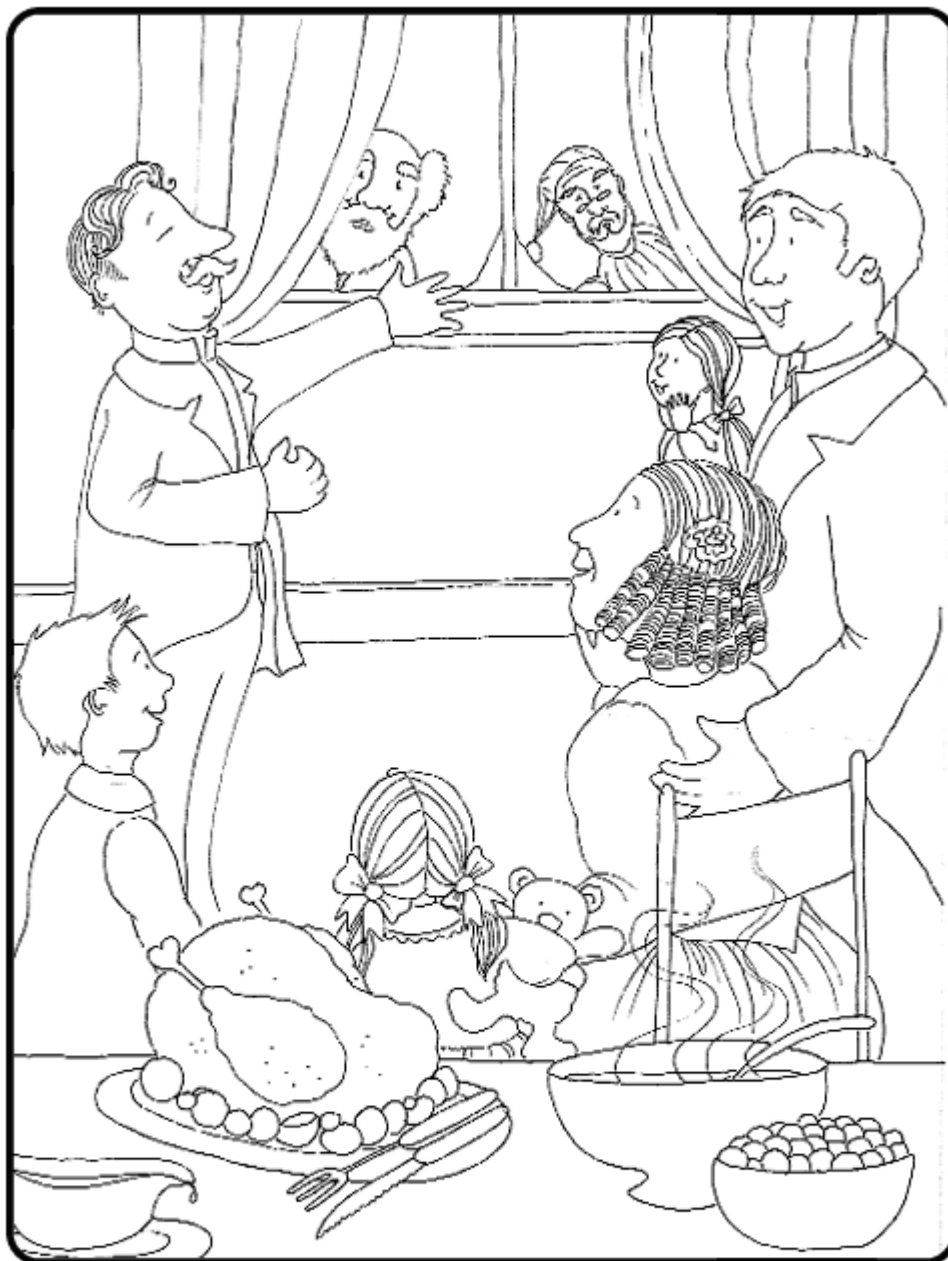

Make 2 holes here and tie together with a piece of string.

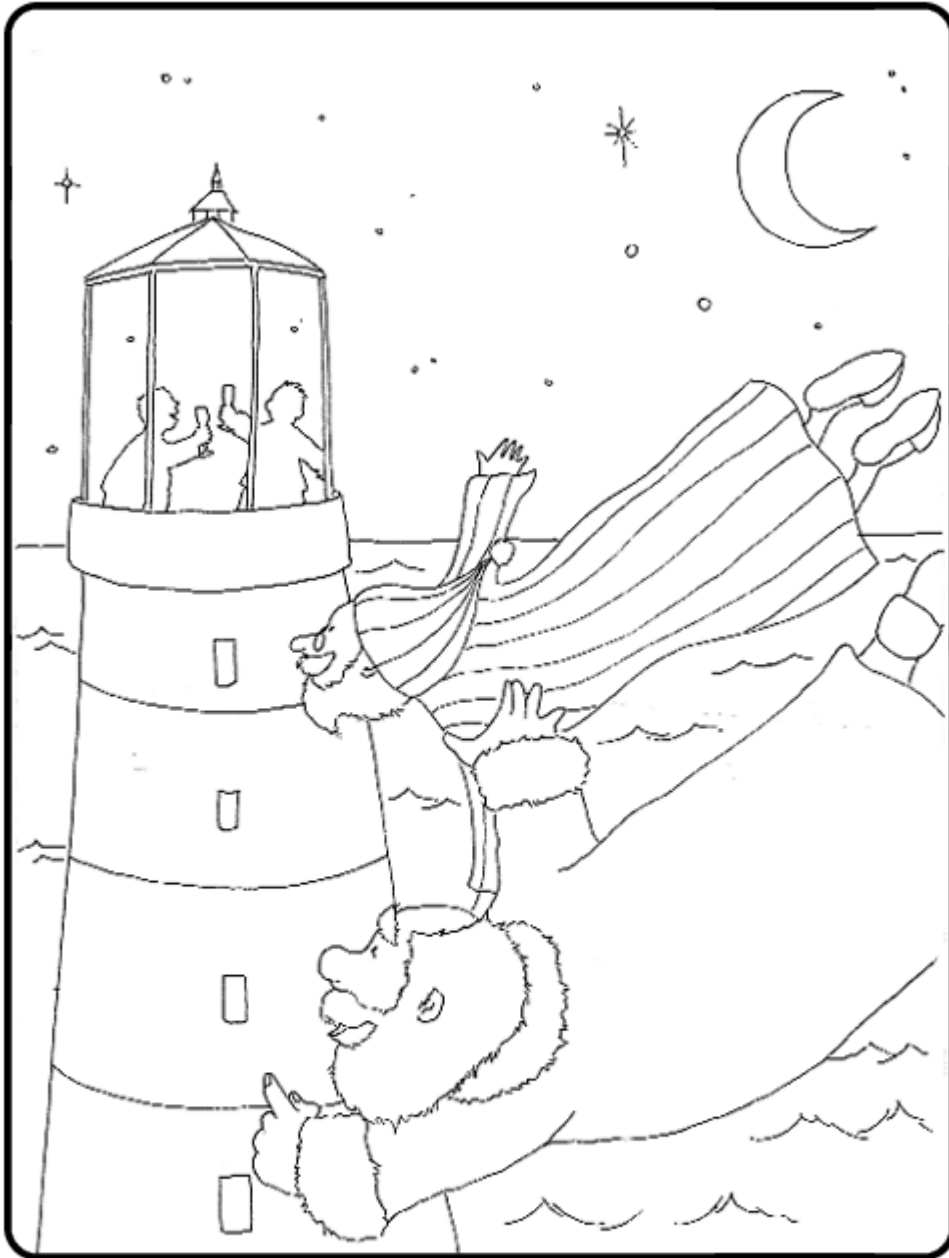
